



## COVID-19 Vaccination – Homebound Individuals

The Grand Chute Fire Department is exploring the possibility of delivering vaccine to homebound people in the Town of Grand Chute. Due to the logistics of vaccine administration, this program is not guaranteed, but the Department is working hard to make it work.

GCFD is administering the Moderna vaccine, which requires 2 shots separated by 28 days (4 weeks).

### Criteria for Eligibility:

- Resident of the Town of Grand Chute.
- Individual is unable to leave their home under normal circumstances.
- Individual is frail and essentially homebound by reasons of illness, disability, or isolation for whom vaccination is appropriate.
- No spouse, domestic partner, or other adult is able or willing to transport individual to a vaccination clinic.
  
- Individual has not already received any doses of the COVID-19 vaccine from another provider.
- Individual has not ever had a severe allergic (anaphylactic) reaction to any component of a COVID-19 vaccine, including polysorbate or polyethylene glycol (PEG), which is found in some medications such as laxatives and preparations for colonoscopy procedures.
- Individual has not had antibody therapy or convalescent plasma for COVID-19 in the past 90 days.

### Program Registration Process:

- Call the Grand Chute Fire Department, 920.832.6050, Mon – Fri between 8 AM and 4 PM
- Provide the following information:
  - First and last names of homebound individual
  - Full address of homebound individuals
  - Phone number for the homebound individual OR another contact person responsible for appointment scheduling (along with the name of the contact person)
  - Email address for the homebound individual OR another contact person responsible for assisting. This is optional – but helps with appointment confirmations and paperwork.

## **Appointment Process – assuming the program moves forward:**

- A Fire Department representative will call to schedule an appointment. This representative will also ask about:
  - Current health status because GCFD cannot vaccinate anyone who is currently ill or in isolation or quarantine due to COVID-19.
  - Other recent vaccinations – COVID-19 vaccination cannot be administered within 14 days of another vaccine.
- If an email was provided at registration or appointment scheduling, an email with forms to review and complete will be sent.
- A Fire Department team of two people will come to the individual's residence at the appointment time to administer the vaccine and monitor for the individual's safety 15-30 minutes. The team is expected to be on site for 30-45 minutes.
- At the appointment for the first dose, the appointment for the second dose will be scheduled for 28-30 days later.
- If an individual becomes sick prior to the appointment, contact GCFD as soon as possible to reschedule.
